Private Applicator License

If you need your pesticide license you can come to the Lewis County Extension Office on February 28th at 6:00 or the Tollesboro volunteer fire department. On March 21st at 6:00 pm. There is no charge to get your license, but there has been some updates to the pesticide laws. Two of these changes included you must be at least 18 years of age and you must have a government issued photo id such as a drivers license. Kentucky Fish and Wildlife seeks information on wild pig sightings

FRANKFORT, Ky. (Jan. 26, 2023) — The Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources is asking the public to report wild pig sightings in Lewis County and surrounding areas after a group of wild pigs was photographed on a trail camera earlier this year.

Wild pigs did not naturally expand into Kentucky. Populations are a result of illegal release.

Wild pigs are an exotic, invasive species that displace game species like deer and turkey, negatively affecting hunter harvest. They also destroy crops and food plots and eat all the acorns in the fall, which many wildlife species heavily rely on as a food source.

Kentucky Fish and Wildlife asks hunters to report wild pigs and refrain from shooting into a group of pigs, also known as a sounder. Hunting fails as a management tool for wild pigs due to their high reproductive rate and intelligence.

In partnership with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Wildlife Services, Kentucky Fish and Wildlife has successfully eradicated several populations of wild pigs in the state and is committed to finding and removing any wild pigs in the area. Free trapping services are available to anyone with a pig presence on their property.

Anyone who sees wild pigs, has wild pig damage, or has trail cam photos or information about an illegal release of pigs is encouraged to submit a report online at fw.ky.gov/wildpigs. 2022 County Committee Election Results

The COC meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 10:00 a.m. at the Vanceburg USDA Service Center. The Regular Session of the meeting is open to the public. The Executive Session, where individual producer information is discussed, is closed to the public.

Emergency Relief Program (ERP) Phase 2 and Pandemic Assistance Revenue Program (PARP)

The Farm Service Agency is accepting applications for Phase Two of the Emergency Relief Program (ERP) and the Pandemic Assistance Revenue Program (PARP). These programs provide assistance for losses from 2020 and 2021 natural disasters or the COVID-19 pandemic. Applications for both programs ends June 2, 2023.

To be eligible for ERP Phase 2 and PARP, producers must have suffered a decrease in allowable gross revenue for the applicable year (2020 or 2021) when compared to a baseline year (2018 or 2019). Crop producers may be eligible for ERP Phase 2. Both crop and livestock producers may be eligible for PARP. We recommend producers begin to gather their tax information (Schedule F, 1099) for 2018-2021. Please give our FSA office a call for more information.

Agricultural Risk Coverage/Price Loss Coverage (ARC/PLC) 2023 Enrollment

Contact the Vanceburg USDA Service Center, (606) 769-3866, to enroll your base acres in ARC/PLC for 2023. The deadline to enroll is March 15, 2023.

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


Dicamba Certification
